

Lingdale golf club is located in Woodhouse Eaves and neighbours Bradgate park. The course itself is an 18 hole parkland course with a wonderful layout and some stunning scenery.

The first hole is a 400 yard par 4, the tee shot is uphill for the first 180 yards or so then as you get over the brow of the hill the hole drops quickly away from you all the way to the green. The second shot will be played on the down slope and you will have to avoid greenside bunkers. A par will be a good start.

Hole 2, 401 yards par 4, The hole dog legs left from the tee, you can go over the corner but you will need to get the ball up fast or play a good draw. The green is two tiered and is protected by a ditch that runs across the fairway 50 yards short, and bunkers too. This a tricky par 4 so early in the round.

Hole 3, 206 yards par 3, this par 3 is protected by distance, bunkers and a small green for a target. This is the hardest par 3 on the course and will require a good tee shot, a par here will feel like a birdie.

Hole 4, 483 yards par 5, this is a very interesting par 5 the hole doglegs at right angles to the left, to get round the corner you need to hit a very good draw. The safe play is straight down and 3 to the green. The green itself is small and has water and bunkers protecting it.

Hole 5, 338 yards par 4, a short par 4 from an elevated tee. The big hitters will take on the water and leave a short pitch in, but you need a good drive to do that. Most golfers will lay up short of the water and leave around 150 yards to the elevated green.

Hole 6, 338 yards par 4, the hole climbs up from the tee and dog legs slightly round to the right this hole will suit a fade from the tee. The green is elevated and you might need one extra club playing in here. This is a birdie chance.
